- Built on the Drupal platform with a tested and tuned set of contributed modules

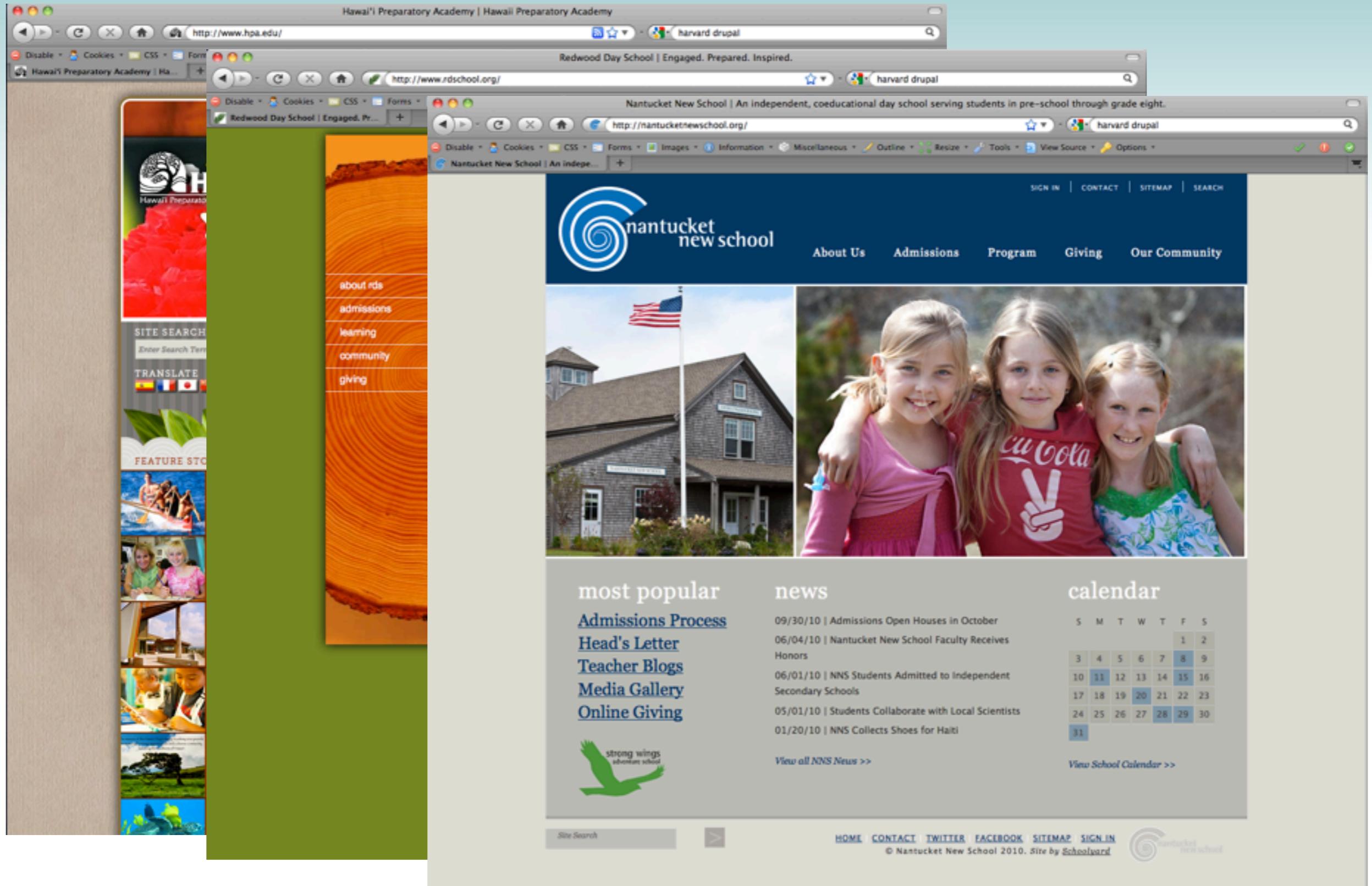
OUR MISSION

WHY? BECAUSE IT'S BETTER FOR THEM

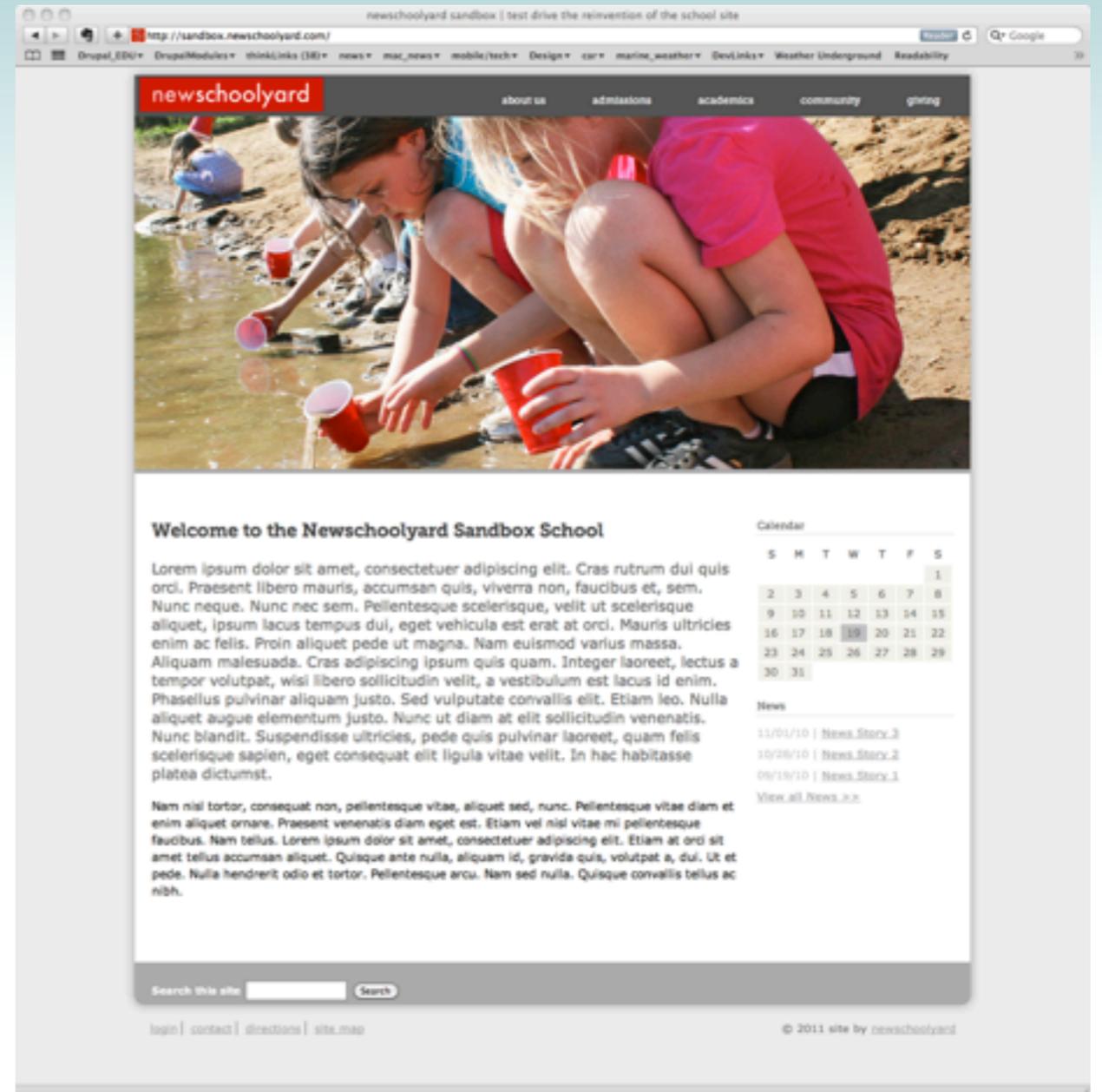
- By focusing on a solid stack of proven technology we can offer real value in areas like Information Architecture, Usability and Design and still cost a fraction of the competition's offerings

- Constantly update our Sandbox in order to be ready to deploy new sites
- Often can be up on a dev URL within an hour or two
- Has lots of proven 'Web 2.0ishness' out of the box, just so you know you're hip



KEEPING CURRENT (NERDY BITS)

- We host everything on easy-to-manage, replicate & deploy virtual LAMP servers with Media Temple
- Transitioning from SVN to Git with remote deploy
- Using LESS.css to speed theming and skinny up our deployed theme files
- Heavy use of CSS3, looking at HTML5
- Will be integrating Apache SOLR/Lucene for kick-ass faceted and contextual search within next couple months

WHERE WE'RE AT

- We have 4 sites live, 5 in the works and are getting new inquiries almost daily
- New office space across the street from the harbor inside the hurricane barriers...
- ...with a bunch of empty desks ;)

WE DO NOT HIRE NINJAS

- Paper cuts are bad enough, but we are looking for some mad skills
- Real designers code. Period. We're looking for a designer who can work from architecture through HTML. CSS should be your best friend, and PHP should only scare you a little.
- Developers shouldn't think 'design' is a dirty word. We make stuff that's really usable (and good design makes it that way). But it's a system that is built with care. If you want to help it grow (and learn a ton yourself), we want to meet you. You should love PHP but be IN love with Drupal (and know why the difference is soooooo important)
